(60 minutes) Liminality is the ambiguity or disorientation that occurs in transitory situations and spaces when a person or group of people is betwixt and between something that has ended, and a new situation not yet begun.

- Conditions that give rise to liminality in an organization Behavioral patterns associated with liminality
- Leadership challenges and opportunities inherent in liminal seasons.



















MOVING FROM DECISION MAKING TO DISCERNMENT 10:00 AM

Most faith-based organizations rely on rational decision making to guide their leadership choices. Liminal seasons invite us to shift out of rational decision-making mode and into a discerning mindset. Discernment is an attentiveness to God that, over time, develops into a shared sense of God's intention for us and our community now. During this session, we will explore the challenge of working with discernment in communal settings during times of high anxiety and uncertainty.



COAXING ORDER OUT OF CHAOS 12:30 PM

Eventually, the disorientation we are experiencing will find resolution. The process by which this happens is known as emergence. Reorientation will occur; it is the natural order of things for coherence to emerge out of chaos. Emergence is naturally leaderless activity. Leaders cannot manage the process on behalf of the organization, but leaders can nurture a climate of disruption, innovation, learning and risk-taking, supporting the emergence of new order as it appears.

LIFE CHANGING MISSION IN SIERRA LEONE

MOHAMED "NABS" NABIEU

This is an overview of the Helping Children Worldwide Ministry through the Child Reintegration Centre, a child welfare organization, and Mercy Hospital, a healthcare institution. Twenty years ago, a group of faith-based and life-changing churches like yours worked to create this vibrant ministry to vulnerable children and families. The CRC works to prevent child labor and trafficking in Sierra Leone, Africa. The Mercy Hospital works to reducing the high infant and maternal mortality rates. The CRC and Mercy Hospital are focused on education, family stability, maternal health, infant survival, childhood nutrition, case management, spiritual mentoring and more. I know of their situation because I was once a vulnerable child. I was rescued from the streets by the Child Reintegration Centre, and I know personally how a life can transform when a church like yours is willing to get involved.



CONNECTING WITH NEW PEOPLE IN A PANDEMIC
